

How to Make This Event Count for YOU

- Explore as many booths as possible, including at least one school you weren't already considering.
- Ask questions. If you're wondering what questions to ask, see below!
- Take good notes.
- Collect contact information from representatives.

Questions to ask the Admissions Staff:

- ❖ What do students like most about your school?
- ❖ I want to do [*job/career field*] after college. What can help me pursue that at your university (major, organizations, internships, etc.)?
- ❖ What housing options are available for new students? Transfer students?
- ❖ What's the average class size on your campus? Average class size for [*major(s) of interest*] classes?
- ❖ What support services do you feel are most critical in connecting with my first semester on campus?
- ❖ What are the professors like and how accessible are they outside of class?
- ❖ Are there internships available specific to my major?
- ❖ How do I get involved with student organizations on campus?
- ❖ Does your school offer special programs like independent studies, study abroad, etc.?
- ❖ What financial aid programs does your college offer?
- ❖ What is the process to apply for financial aid opportunities specific to your school as an incoming freshman? New transfers?
- ❖ If I'm transferring in credit from another institution, what tools can I use to ensure I'm completing the required prerequisites and to see how they transfer?
- ❖ Is there a housing requirement for new freshmen? New transfer students?

Questions to ask the Current Students:

- ❖ Why did you choose this college?
- ❖ Did you feel supported as a new student, whether as a first year a transfer student?
- ❖ Any advice for incoming freshmen or transfer students?
- ❖ How approachable are the professors, staff, and administration at your college?
- ❖ Can you speak about your residence/dining hall experience?
- ❖ What do you do on the weekends?
- ❖ What extracurricular activities or organizations are you involved with?
